Dear scouts and families,

On behalf of our charter organization (Scotts Valley Host Lions Club), the troop committee and adult leadership team, we are very happy that you are considering our troop as your new scouting home. Here in Troop 614, we value family, friendship, and community. We are wholly youth-led and believe in the ideals of scouting, namely: character development, leadership development, citizenship training, and personal fitness. In addition, we focus on scout skills, cooking skills, and first aid. We strive to make Troop 614 welcoming to scouts of all ages, skills, and abilities.

We know that choosing your new troop is a personal choice, and we believe you and your scout should be both comfortable and excited as you move into your new scouting family. Here are some things to factor in as you consider as making 614 your new troop:

- We are the first and only linked troop in the area (a troop for both boys and girls).
- We live by the Patrol Method. Scouts self-organize in smaller groups to practice new skills, teach others, and plan events like campouts, hikes, and advancements.
- We regularly support our community through volunteering. Each year, we support an annual crab feed, teach CPR, host a flag retirement ceremony, lead flag ceremonies, walk in the 4th of July parade, and support many other service projects.

- We value teamwork and youth leadership! We believe in giving scouts the opportunity to develop strong leadership skills throughout their time in Scouts BSA. We work together to ensure that each scout is able to have fun and achieve his or her goals.

Troop Meetings

Our troop meets every second and fourth Wednesday of the month at St. Philip Episcopal Church in Scotts Valley (5271 Scotts Valley Drive). The meetings are from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. We meet throughout the year and may occasionally move the meeting date to work around holidays, spring break, and summer camp.

For scouts in leadership positions, there is one additional meeting per month (the patrol leaders council or PLC). These meetings are typically on the third Wednesday of the month and the Scotts Valley Boys and Girls Club (5060 Scotts Valley Drive) from 7:00 to 8:30 PM.

Activities

Our goal is to provide a variety of outdoor adventures each month. These include:

- Campouts, hikes, and other events at least once a month
- At least one week of Summer Camp
- High adventure trips for older scouts
- District- or Council-level events
